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

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
AUGUST 2019

In August 2019, **Spain's exports dropped by 6.2%** year-on-year in nominal terms to 19,436.3 million euros, and **imports decreased by 1.5%** to 23,421.2 million euros. With seasonally adjusted data, exports fell by 3.6% year-on-year, while imports increased by 1.4%. In **real terms**, exports shrank by 5.4% year-on-year, as export prices declined by 0.9%, whereas imports advanced by 2.8%, as import prices diminished by 4.1%. In nominal terms on a **month-on-month** basis, exports dropped by 23.1%, and imports fell by 15.7%. With seasonally adjusted data, exports decreased by 0.9% month-on-month, while imports rose by 1.4%.




Spain's **trade balance** registered a deficit of 3,984.9 million euros, up from a deficit of 3,057.3 million euros in August 2018 (provisional data). The export/import **coverage ratio** reached 83.0%, 4.2 percentage points lower than in the same month of 2018 (87.1% in August 2018 with provisional data). The **non-energy trade balance** reached a deficit of 2,112.9 million euros, up from a deficit of 802.0 million in the same month of 2018. The **energy trade deficit** fell by 17.0% year-on-year to 1,872.0 million euros (compared to a deficit of 2,255.2 million euros in August 2018).


Sectoral data

Spain's **main exporting sectors** in August 2019 were *capital goods* (representing 20.4% of total exports and growing by 0.8% year-on-year), *food, beverages and tobacco* (17.6% of total, decreasing by 0.6%), *chemical products* (15.1% of total, falling by 1.6%) and *consumption goods* (12.0% of total, diminishing by 4.3%).



The most significant sectors of Spain's imports were capital goods (representing 19.6% of total imports and advancing by 2.2% year-on-year), energy (15.6% of total, diminishing by 17.0%), chemical products (15.3% of total, rising by 0.2%) and consumption goods (14.0% of total, declining by 2.0%).

Among subsectors, the largest contributions to the annual change in Spain's exports in August 2019 (down by 6.2%) came from telecommunication equipment (0.8 points), meat products (0.4 points) and railway transport equipment (0.2 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to iron and steel (-1.9 points), oil and by-products (-1.6 points) and cars and motorcycles (-0.7 points).




The subsectors with the most positive contribution to the annual change in Spain's imports in August 2019 (down by 1.5%) were cars and motorcycles (1.7 points), other food products (0.8 points) and telecommunication equipment (0.6 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to oil and byproducts (-2.3 points), coal and electricity (-0.7 points) and fishery products (-0.3 points).


Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)

Geographic data

Exports to the **European Union** accounted for 62.9% of total exports in August 2019 (up from 62.6% in August 2018) and decreased by 5.8% year-on-year. Exports to the **euro area** ran at 47.7% (down from 48.5% in August 2018) and fell by 7.7%. Exports to **non-EU countries** represented 37.1% of total exports (down from 37.4% in August 2018) as they diminished by 6.8% year-on-year.




Imports from the **European Union** amounted to 50.3% of total imports in August 2019 (up from 48.7% in August 2018) and grew by 1.6% year-on-year. Imports from the **euro area** represented 39.1% (same value as in August 2018) and declined by 1.6%. Imports from **non-EU countries** accounted for 49.7% of total imports in August 2019 (down from 51.3% in August 2018) as they shrank by 4.4% year-on-year.



Trade balance with the European Union showed in August 2019 a surplus of 444.0 million euros (down from a surplus of 1,386.1 million in August 2018) and a surplus of 108.3 million euros with the euro area (733.5 million surplus in August 2018). **Trade deficit with the rest of the world** decreased to 4,429.0 million euros (from a deficit of 4,443.3 million euros in August 2018).

The **destinations with the largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **exports** in August 2019 (down by 6.2%) were Turkey (0.7 percentage points), Sweden (0.4 points), Switzerland (0.2 points) and Norway (0.2 points). Those destinations with the largest negative contributions were the Netherlands (-0.9 points), Singapore (-0.7 points), Germany (-0.7 points) and Italy (-0.6 points).



Regarding **imports**, the **countries with the largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **imports** in August 2019 (down by 1.5%) were Germany (0.8 percentage points), Russia (0.7 points), the United States (0.7 points) and Iraq (0.4 points). The destinations with the largest negative contributions were Iran (-1.3 points), Italy (-0.7 points), Portugal (-0.6 points) and Brazil (-0.6 points).

International data

In comparison to other geographical areas, Spain's exports of goods dropped by 6.2% year-on-year in August, a higher decrease than those of the euro area (-3.7%) and the European Union (-3.9%). Within the European Union, exports also diminished in Germany (-3.9%), France (-0.4%), Italy (-3.4%) and the United Kingdom (-11.9%). Outside the European Union, the United States exports decreased by 1.0%, China's by 1.2% and Japan's by 8.2%.


JANUARY - AUGUST 2019

Spain's exports expanded by 1.1% in the period of January-August 2019 compared to the same period of 2018 to 192,131.2 million euros, and imports grew by 1.2% year-on-year to 213,314.4 million euros. In real terms, exports increased by 0.3% year-on-year, as export prices advanced by 0.9%, and imports rose by 0.6% year-on-year, as import prices augmented by 0.5%.

Spain's trade deficit increased to 21,183.2 million euros compared to the same period of 2018 (deficit of 20,890.2 million euros). The export/import **coverage ratio** reached 90.1%, same value as in the same period of 2018 (provisional data). The **non-energy trade balance** reached a deficit of 5,347.7 million euros, compared to a deficit of 4,164.1 million euros in January-August 2018, whereas the **energy trade deficit** declined by 5.3% year-on-year to 15,835.4 million euros.

Sectoral data


Spain's **main exporting sectors** in the period of January-August were *capital goods* (representing 20.5% of total exports, rising by 6.0% year-on-year), *food, beverages and tobacco* (16.7% of total, expanding by 3.9%), *vehicles* (15.0% of total, declining by 4.8%) and *chemical products* (14.7% of total, advancing by 3.4%).



The **largest shares by sector of Spain's imports** were those of *capital goods* (representing 21.1% of total and increasing by 3.9% year-on-year), *chemical products* (16.1% of total imports, expanding by 6.4%), *energy* (14.0% of total imports, shrinking by 3.9%) and *vehicles* (12.7% of total imports, falling by 0.4%).

Among **subsectors**, the largest contributions to the annual change in Spain's **exports** (up by 1.1%) were *aircraft* (0.6 percentage points), *medicines* (0.4 points) and *fruits, vegetables and legumes* (0.3 points). On the other hand, the major negative contributions by subsectors corresponded to *cars and motorcycles* (-0.6 points), *electrical machinery* (-0.3 points) and *minerals* (-0.2 points).

Exports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)




Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)

The subsectors with the most positive contributions to the annual change in Spain's imports in January-August 2019 (up by 1.2%) were telecommunication equipment (0.4 points), organic chemical products (0.4 points) and garment (0.3 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to oil and by-products (-0.5 points), minerals (-0.5 points) and aircraft (-0.3 points).

Geographic data


Exports to the **European Union** represented 65.7% of total exports in the period (equal value as in the same period of 2018) and expanded by 1.1% year-on-year, and exports to the **euro area** ran at 51.3% of total (51.5% in the same period of 2018) and increased by 0.6%. Exports to the **rest of the world** amounted to 34.3% of total exports (similar value as in the same period of 2018) and rose by 1.2% year-on-year.




Imports from the **European Union** accounted for 53.1% of total imports in January-August 2019 (down from 53.8% in the same period of 2018) and diminished by 0.2% year-on-year. Imports from the **euro area** amounted to 42.2% (43.5% in the same period of 2018) and fell by 2.0%. Imports from the **rest of the world** ran at 46.9% of total imports (46.2% in the same period of 2018) and went up by 2.7% year-on-year.

Spain's trade surplus with the European Union and with the euro area increased to 12,886.5 million euros and to 8,594.1 million euros respectively, from surpluses of 11,332.2 million and 6,095.3 million euros in the same period of the previous year. The trade deficit with the rest of the world advanced by 5.7% year-on-year to 34,069.7 million euros.

In terms of contribution to the annual change of exports (up by 1.1%), the main contributions were those of Switzerland (0.3 percentage points), Portugal (0.3 points), the United States (0.2 points) and South Korea (0.2 points). Those destinations with the largest negative contributions were Turkey (-0.4 points), Belgium (-0.3 points), Saudi Arabia (-0.2 points) and Argentina (-0.2 points).




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
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In the period January-August, the number of Spanish exporters over 1.000 euros attained 79,279, 0.1% more than in the same period of 2018, out of which 33,960 had already exported at least 50,000 euros worth of goods in the period, 1.2% more than in the same period of the previous year with an increase in exports of 1.1%. With regard to regular exporters (those that have already exported in the current year as well as in each of the three preceding years), they amounted to 50,865 in the period, 31.1% of total exporters and 2.3% more than in the same period of 2018. Their exports reached 183,551.3 million, 95.5% of total exports and 0.9% more than in the same period of the previous year.

International data

In comparison to other geographical areas, Spain's exports of goods expanded by 1.1% year-on-year in the period of January-August 2019, a lower rate than those attained by the euro area (2.2%) and the European Union (2.4%). Within the European Union, exports also increased in Germany (0.4%), France (4.2%) and Italy (2.6%), whereas those of the United Kingdom fell (-0.4%). Outside the European Union, the United States exports fell by 0.9% and Japan's by 4.7% whereas those of China remained stable.

METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

- The statistics presented in this report correspond to international trade in goods statistics of declared trade data provided by the Spanish <u>Customs and Excise Department</u> (Tax Agency) and compiled according to the UN Manual of International Merchandise Trade Statistics (IMTS 2010). It does not include Intra-EU estimates for trade below the exemption threshold.
- Data for the reference year are provisional. Final data are published at the end of the following year. In between, they are not subject to revision. In provisional data, those Intrastat operations being informed after the publication of its corresponding reference month will be assigned to the nearest pending month. Notwithstanding, in the final data all operations will be assigned to their corresponding reference month. Year-on-year percentage change is always calculated with homogenous data (provisional over provisional basis, even if final data are already available for the previous year).
- Information in real terms is provided by the Ministry of Economy and Business and it is calculated using Unit Value Indices.
- Data seasonally adjusted: the estimation of the model, the decomposition of the series and its seasonal and calendar adjustment have been carried out manually using TRAMO-SEATS program. The calendar regressors have been calculated taking into account INE's "Standard for adjusting seasonal and calendar effects in short-term series" (link). The selected models are: ARIMA (0,1,1) x (0,1,1) for exports and ARIMA (0,1,1) x (0,1 or imports, with the series in logarithms.

The user can make personalized queries according to different variables such as: flow, country, commodity or Spanish region.
- Spain's trade data presented in this report differ from those published by Eurostat in application of different methodologies: Spain's Customs (<u>link</u>, in Spanish) and Eurostat (<u>link</u>).





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
