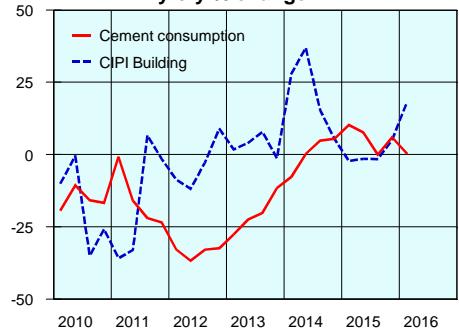

y-o-y % change**



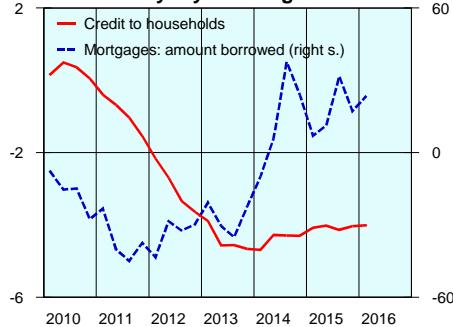

y-o-y % change (smoothed)**



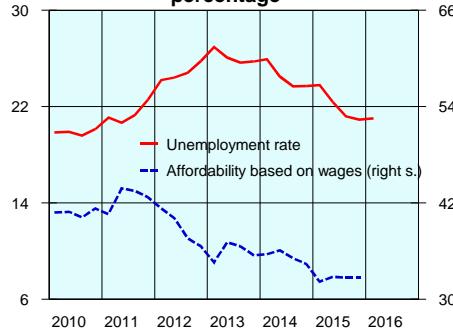
**CREDIT FOR HOUSE PURCHASE & MORTGAGES

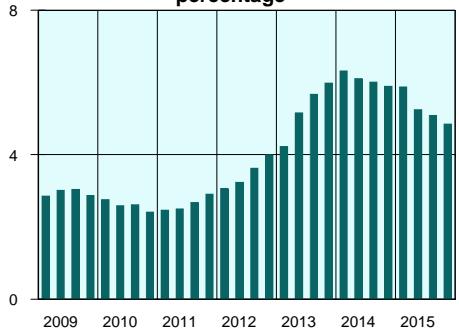
